Project Description

In this project, students will discover the transformative world of the pond in the spring. The students will have an unforgettable experience of sampling life in a beautiful natural pond at the Morgan Arboretum accompanied by a seasoned naturalist and guide. As the children dip their nets, many discoveries will be made about the creatures who start their lives in the water of the pond but who will then leave the pond for forests or fields. These true **`Transformers`** will awaken in your students a sense of wonderment and connection with the natural world and will offer a cornucopia of learning possibilities.

Project sequence:

1. On **May 3rd**, teachers will meet at the Morgan Arboretum (Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue) for a day of preparation with the naturalist. **The workshop is compulsory for the teachers.**
2. Between **May 29 and June 6**, classes will spend the day at the Morgan Arboretum.
3. In class, students will create a collaborative tool to explain their learning to peers and parents.
